After completion of the qualification the graduate must register as a Candidate Planner

To be able to register as a Technical Planner or Professional Planner as indicated there are a number of requirements that must be met, being:

- A person is required to have both a recognised academic planning qualification and have completed a period of practical training;
- Must have been registered as a Candidate Planners for a minimum of two years;
- The practical training must be for a total period of at least 24 months;
- The period of 24 months practical training must be undertaken after obtaining the relevant planning qualification.
- For registration as a Technical Planner the practical training must be undertaken under the guidance of a registered Technical or Professional Planner, with a minimum of three (3) years post registration experience;
- For registration as a Professional Planner the practical training must be undertaken under the guidance of a registered Professional Planner, with a minimum of three (3) years post registration experience; and

The person must have been registered as a candidate planner for at least two (2) years.
